UPDATED LUNCH ORDER MENU FOR TERM 4

SCIENCE, READING AND MATHS TESTING (YEAR 1 - 6 STUDENTS)

All Year 1 to 6 students will complete a <u>Progressive Achievement</u> <u>Tests</u> (PAT) Reading and Maths test in the first two weeks of Term 4. These Reading and Mathematics tests are based on the Australian Curriculum, but are also adaptive, meaning the test moves to easier or harder questions depending on the child's responses to previous questions.

Our students are assessed using the PAT Reading and Maths tests at the same each year to enable us to measure individual progress and check student achievement levels. These assessments are considered alongside the teacher's judgements, and with other external assessments such as On Entry (P-2), Year 3 and Year 5 NAPLAN, to be sure we know where individual students and cohorts of students are at. This data is used to plan at the individual, classroom and whole school level.

There is no need for children to be concerned about these tests, and no preparation is required. Catch up testing will be held during Week 2 for students who were absent when their class was assessed in one or both of these assessments.

YEAR 6 TALK MONEY INCURSION (WORKSHOP 1)

Today, the Year 6 classes will be having a free hour long incursion by Talk Money. A guest speaker will visit each Year 6 classroom and present workshop, providing an introduction to money and key finance concepts for primary school students.

At 11:00am on **Monday**, **11 November** we will observe a period of silence in our classes to remember all those who have died or suffered in wars and armed conflicts.




SCIENCE EXPO (YEAR 6 STUDENTS, PARENTS, COMMUNITY, YEAR 1-5 STUDENTS)

ADHD PARENT WORKSHOP

This year, we have been focussing as a staff on expanding our knowledge of how to make students with diagnoses of ADHD thrive at our school.

Part of our process on ADHD is to also strengthen our understanding of students with ADHD and working with families to ensure the strategies we use at school are relevant and effective, and align with those used at home.

Piara Waters PS parents are invited to attend a workshop at 6:30pm, on **Monday, 18 November.** Run by ADHD coach and educator <u>Eliza Dadson</u>, this parent information session covers information on Attention Deficit Hyperactive Disorder (ADHD) including the difference between boys and girls with ADHD, strategies to support your child and sharing some of the strategies used by our classroom teachers.

SCIENCE INCURSION – REPTILES (YEAR 3 & 6)

To extend our year 3 and 5 students' learning about the biological science outcomes, all classes will participate in a reptile incursion on either **Wednesday**, **20 or Thursday**, **21 of November**. A reminder about our school uniform
