#### 2025, TERM 1 STAFFING UPDATE

A special welcome to our newly recruited staff:

- Miss Zoe Marmara will teach Year 2 in room 16. She has been teaching Year 2 at Harrisdale Primary School for the last few years. She undertook a practicum at our school and was keen to return. Welcome back, Zoe!

The region has allocated *Miss Elise Scudds* as our School Psychologist. Elise will work on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and most Fridays.

The Department of Health has re-alocated *Emily Cardy* as our school nurse. Emily is returning from maternity leave. The School Nurse will focus on checks for all Kindergarten children in the coming months.

#### SPECIALIST CLASSES AND LIBRARY TIME

We have several specialist teachers who teach our Pre-primary to year 6 classes. You can find out which specialist classes your child has <u>HERE</u>.

You can find out what day your child's class visits the library <u>HERE</u>. Library visits will commence on Thursday of this week. If your child forgets to bring a bag, they will read books in the library at this time instead of borrowing.

#### **EXTREME WEATHER**

The weather for the first week of the term is forecast to be extreme (the high 30s). In extremely hot weather;

- All lunchboxes and drink bottles are stored inside (please take them inside this week!).
- Physical Education lessons are modified and take place indoors.
- Our play areas are adjusted so students can play inside at recess and lunchtime. Our extreme weather play plan is available <u>HERE</u>.



Our Junior Choir (Year 2 and 3) and Senior Choir (Year 4/5/6) will recommence from Week 2. This year, the Junior and Senior choir will commence at 7:45am in the Music Room.

The Junior Choir will meet on Mondays, beginning Monday, 10 February (7:45 - 8:30 a.m.). All Year 2 and 3 students are welcome. At the end of term 1, we will ask students to decide if they want to remain in the choir and this will be confirmed with a choir contract.

The Senior Choir will be held on Wednesdays, beginning Wednesday, 12 February (7:45 - 8:45 a.m.). All year, 4/5/6 students are welcome. After a few weeks, we will also ask students to decide if they want to remain in the choir and this will be confirmed with a choir contract.

Students should bring their school bags to choir. When the session finishes, students will make their way to class. Students are on time and do not need to go to the office for a late pass.

## Any child who would like to try out choir or join the choir is welcome to attend. Auditions are not required.



#### LUNCH ORDER SERVICE

Munch Box Food Service will continue to provide the school with a lunch order service. Orders need to be placed by 9am through the <u>Spriggy Schools</u> website or app. Further information regarding the lunch service can be found <u>HERE</u>, including the Term 1 menu.

#### **PARKING AND TRAFFIC**

We are a large school and it is not possible for every family to secure a car park close to the school. We encourage our students and families to walk, ride or scoot to school if they can.

- If you drive to school, we encourage students to be dropped off and picked up at the **Kiss and Drive area** on Wright Road. A reminder that in this area, cars pull up, children exit on the left hand door of the vehicle, and walk themselves to/from class. A deputy principal/principal will be on duty every morning from 8:10am to 8:25am and afternoon from 2:30pm to 2:45pm at the Kiss n Drive area.
- Our Kindergarten and Pre-primary parents may use the **Early Childhood car park** on Jolley Avenue. This is a short-stay car park, only for a few minutes, while K and P parents quickly collect their child from class and return straight away. A deputy principal or principal will be on duty every afternoon from 2:30 p.m. to 2:45 p.m.

## **EVENTS IN MARCH**

#### NAPLAN (Years 3 and 5)

Between the **12th and the 23rd of March**, the students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in NAPLAN Reading, Writing and Mathematics assessments.

As part of their preparation for NAPLAN, the students will participate in a range of online practice tests using the school iPads. These practice tests are a good opportunity for the students to learn how to use the online platform and familiarise themselves with the format for answering questions and completing the tasks.

The practice tests are not 'marked' and the data is not stored. However, they are administrated in a similar format to the NAPLAN tests and allow us to check our IT equipment and network. More information for parents about the NAPLAN testing is <u>here</u>.
