**Dear Parents and Carers** 

We had a fabulous first full week at school, with lots of fantastic learning taking place. It's been great to see how easily our students are settling into their new routines and timetables.

On Friday, some Year 2 students used Valentine's Day to develop the new friendships they are making in class. They worked together on a range of learning tasks.



This week in Science, as part of International Women and Girls in Science day, pre primary classes learnt about Palaeontologist, Mary Anning and dinosaur fossils. Year 1 classes learnt about Zoologist, Jane Goodall and the ways we can help wildlife.





#### **STUDENT UPDATE FORMS** (All students)

It is important that we have up-to-date student contact and medical records so that we can contact families when required.

On Monday, February 17, students will be sent home with a printout of the information in our system for parents to review and edit as needed.

#### **ON-ENTRY ASSESSMENT** (PRE-PRIMARY)

Over the next four weeks, Pre-primary students will be participating in the state-wide On-entry Assessment Program. It is a requirement that all Pre-primary students undertake the assessment.



During this time, Pre-primary teachers will spend one-on-one time with each student in their class to find out about their literacy and numeracy skills and understandings. The teacher will use this information to plan and target teaching programs to suit each child's learning needs. During the assessment, a relief teacher will teach the class.

The literacy assessment tasks for Pre-primary students include:

- Speaking and listening engage in conversation
- Reading recognise rhyming words, identify the sounds in letters and words, listen and respond to questions about stories read to them.
- Writing draw a picture and attempt to write their name and words about their picture.

The numeracy tasks for Pre-primary students include:

- Number identify, count, and match small quantities and numbers.
- Measurement compare length and weight by observing and touching the objects.
- Geometry identify shapes and simple 'position' words.

Parents will be given a summary of their child's results towards the end of the term. These summaries provide an overview of your child's responses to questions and tasks completed during the assessment and include some ideas about how you can help your child at home.

\*\*Please note, Pre-Primary to year 4 swimming lessons are held at the Swimming Pool in term 3.


# WEEK 3 EVENTS


#### **SENIOR ASSEMBLY (YR 3-6)**
