PARENT VOLUNTEER DECLARATION FORM

There have been reforms to strengthen Working with Children legislation, effective 1st July 2023.

Parent volunteers must now complete a *Parent and Child Volunteer Declaration Form* prior to commencing volunteer child-related work on a school site. These forms will be available from the front office. This form only needs to be completed once, unless your circumstances change.

You **will** need to complete a declaration form if you volunteer at PWPS, for example:

- Helping with reading
- Attending a day excursion
- Assisting at a sports carnival or Running Club
- Conducting P&C duties



You do **not** need to complete a declaration form to:

- Pick up or drop off your child at school
- Attend school events
- Meet with teachers or the leadership team

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia are required to provide information about the supports they provide to students with disability.

Information includes:

- Year of schooling
- Category of disability physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotion
- Level of support provided in the classroom supplementary, substantial or extensive

This NCCD data provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability. NCCD does not require students to be involved in any additional testing processes. The data provided to the Australian Government ensures individual students cannot be identified.

The government requires students to apply to enrol in Kindergarten, and then re-enrol for Pre-primary and also Year 7. Enrolments for Kindergarten, Pre-primary and Year 7 students closed on Friday, 21st July across all WA Public Schools. If your child is entering Kindergarten, Pre-primary or Year 7 in 2024 and you have not completed the enrolment process, please do this as a matter of urgency.

P&C FATHER'S DAY SOCK DRIVE







